


1-Click Actions for Photoshop

To install the actions click here and select "Load Actions" from the menu. Locate your 1click .atn files and click open. Repeat for all the 1click atn files.

In this instance the 1ClickSplitTones set is open and the Red/Green action selected.

Things to watch out for.

Most actions work on 16bit or 8bit images but some Photoshop functions are 8bit only.
The starting image should be in RGB format.
To be on the safe side it is preferable to have only one image open when running an action.
It is recommended that the starting image is flattened before running the actions (ie just the background layer).
Some of the actions may take several minutes to run on large images.
The actions are tested on Photoshop CS and CS2 - not all work with earlier versions (although many do).
To vary the strength of an action simply change the opacity of the adjustment layer(s) the action creates.

Tips when using brushes.

When using the Dodge/Burn actions and the portrait retouching tools you can alter the strength by varying the brush opacity as well as the layer opacity.
D - resets colours to Black/White
X - switches between black and white
[and] change the brushes size.

Click here to open the "1ClickFilters" set.

Click here runs the selected action (in this case the Red/Green action from the SplitTones set)

The icons in this column indicate that a dialog is contained in the actions. There is not normally any reason to click here.
