Dispersion Photoshop Action

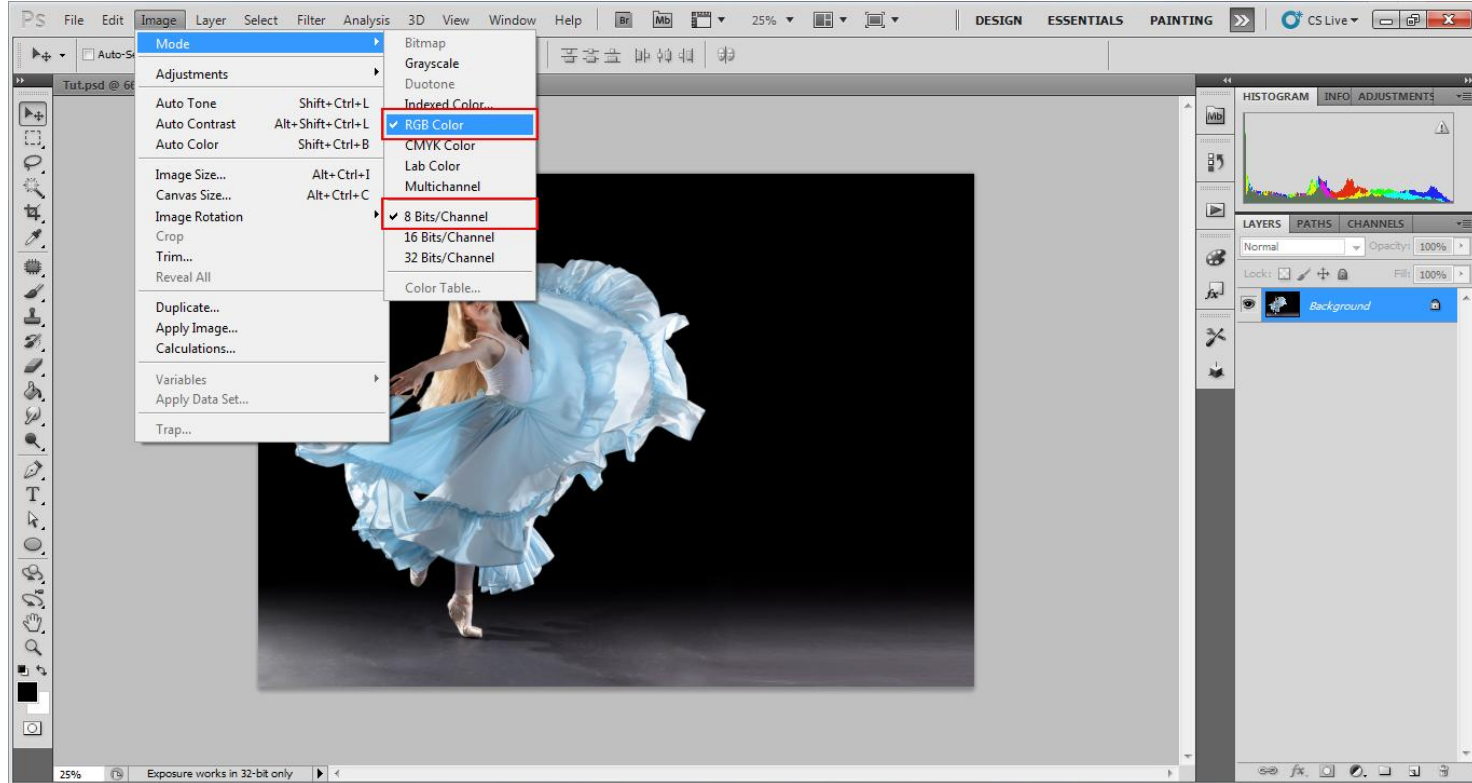
This action has been tested and working on Photoshop (English version only) CS3,CS4,CS5,CS6,CC Higher

-  Your photo is in RGB color mode
-  Your photo is in 8bit color mode
-  You are running the English version of Photoshop.
-  Avoid using small resolution images. For the best results, use Photos between 1500px - 3000px high/wide.

How to Use the Action

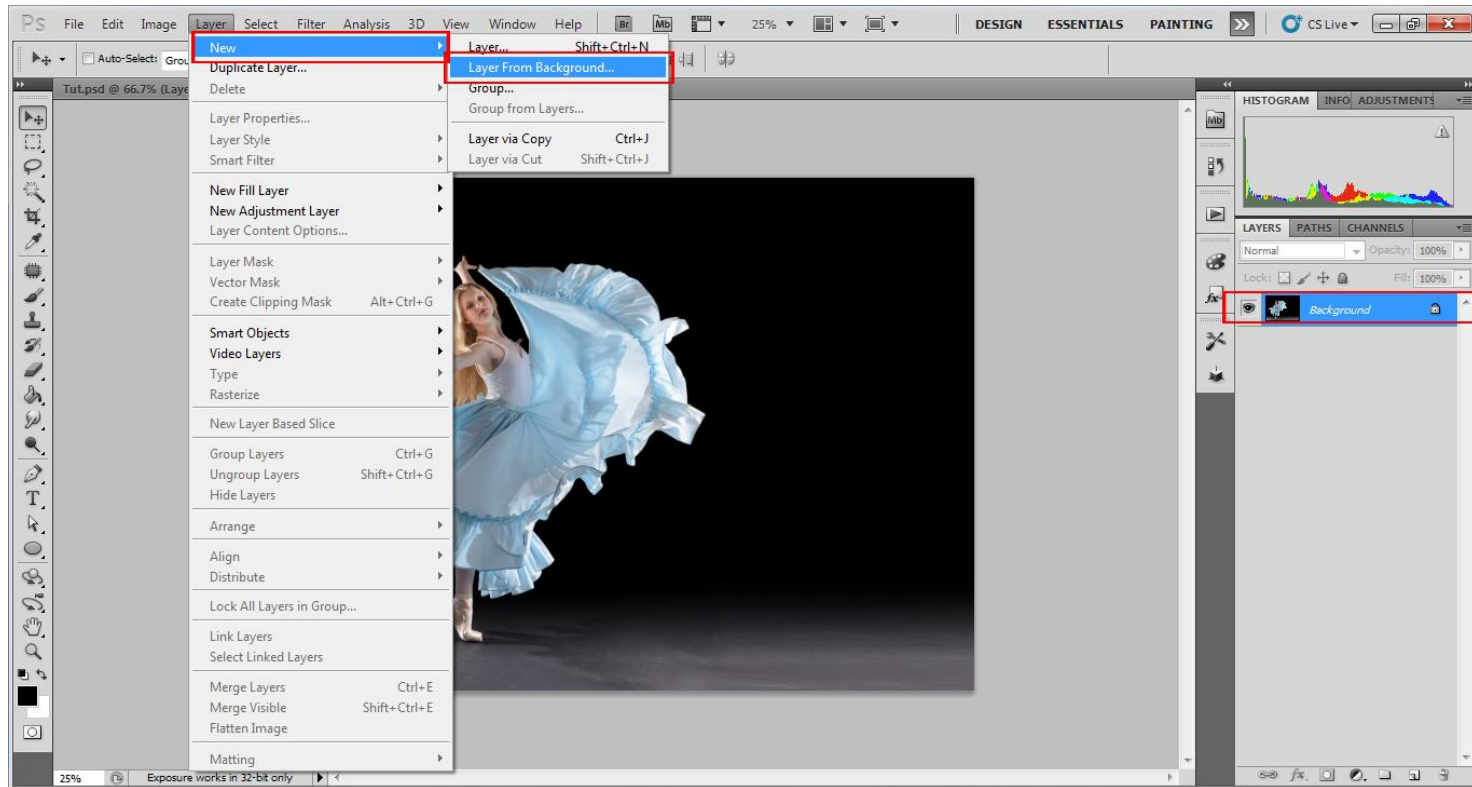
1. Your photo is in RGB color mode 2. Your photo is in 8bit color mod

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How to Use the Action

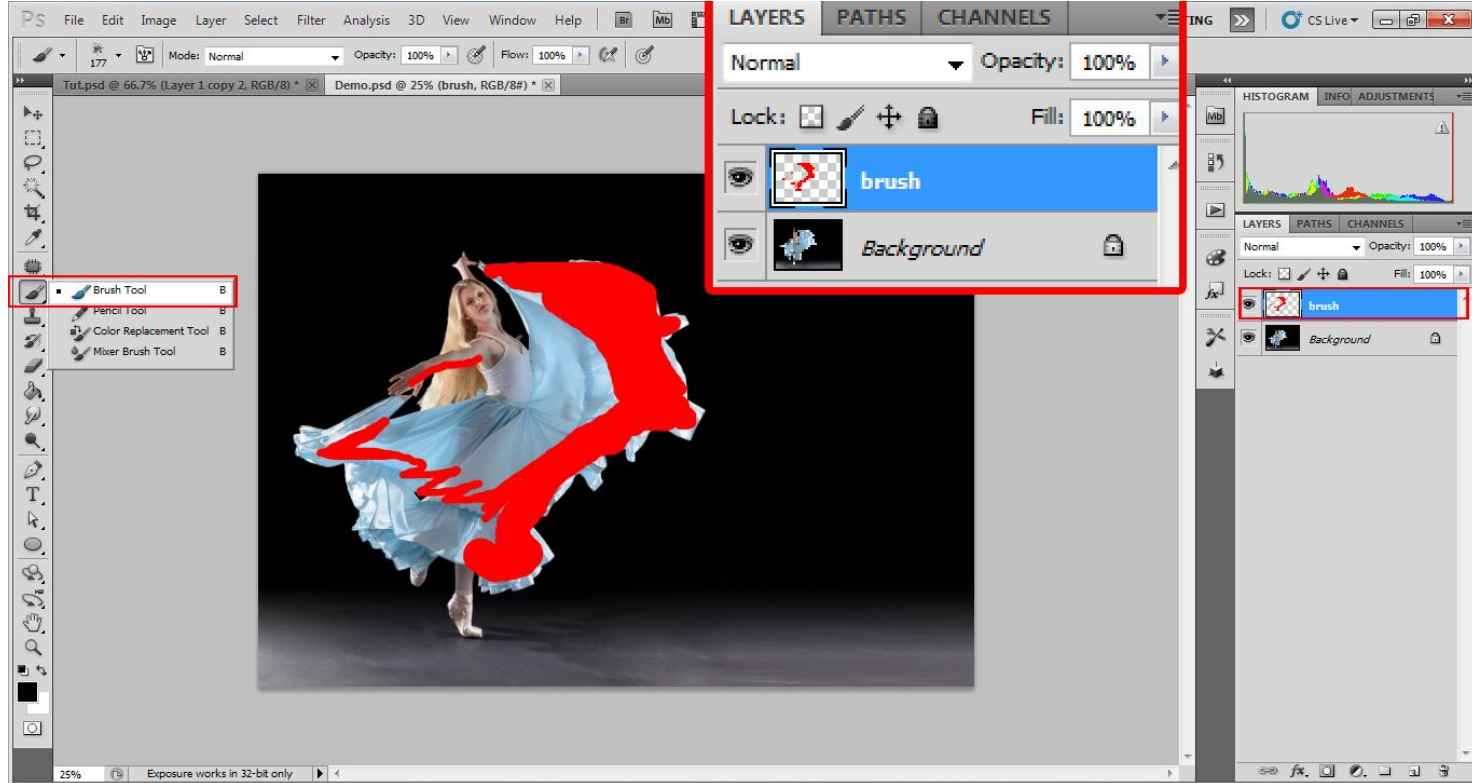
Leave the photo layer locked and set as the 'Background'. To set your photo as the Background, select your photo layer and go to the menu 'Layer' --> 'New'--> 'Layer from Background..'



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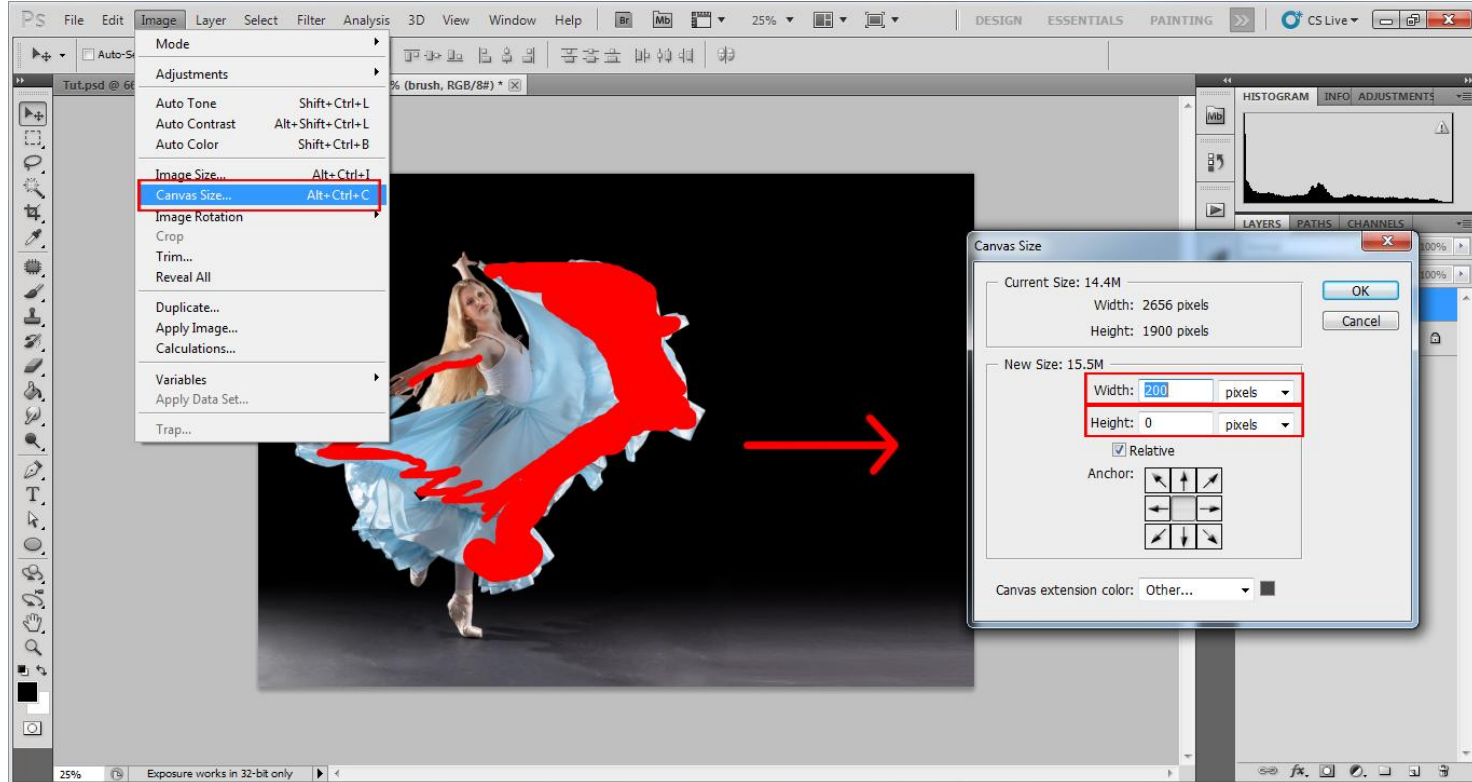
Create a new layer above the background layer called 'brush'. MUST be all lowercase. .. With the 'brush' layer selected, brush onto the areas of your photo that you want to apply the effect.



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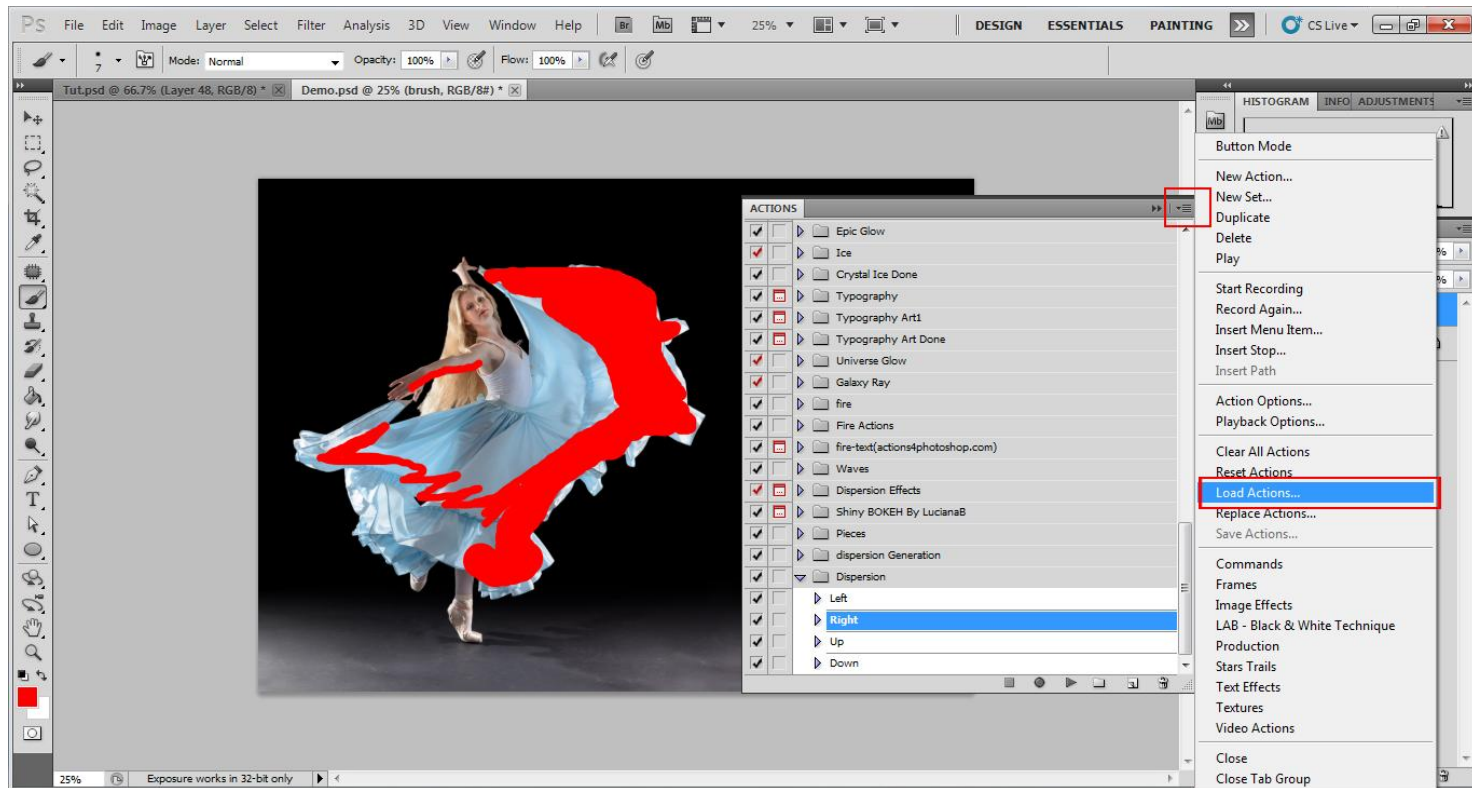
Resize the image dimensions and canvas image in the Action's Direction to show the details of the Dispersion action ... Go to Images ... Canvas Size ... from the Panel of canvas .Add the width and height you want , make sure the Relative is checkedas shown below ...then click ...OK



How to Install the Action

Inside Photoshop, go to the 'Window' menu and select 'Actions'. A window will now appear to the right hand side.

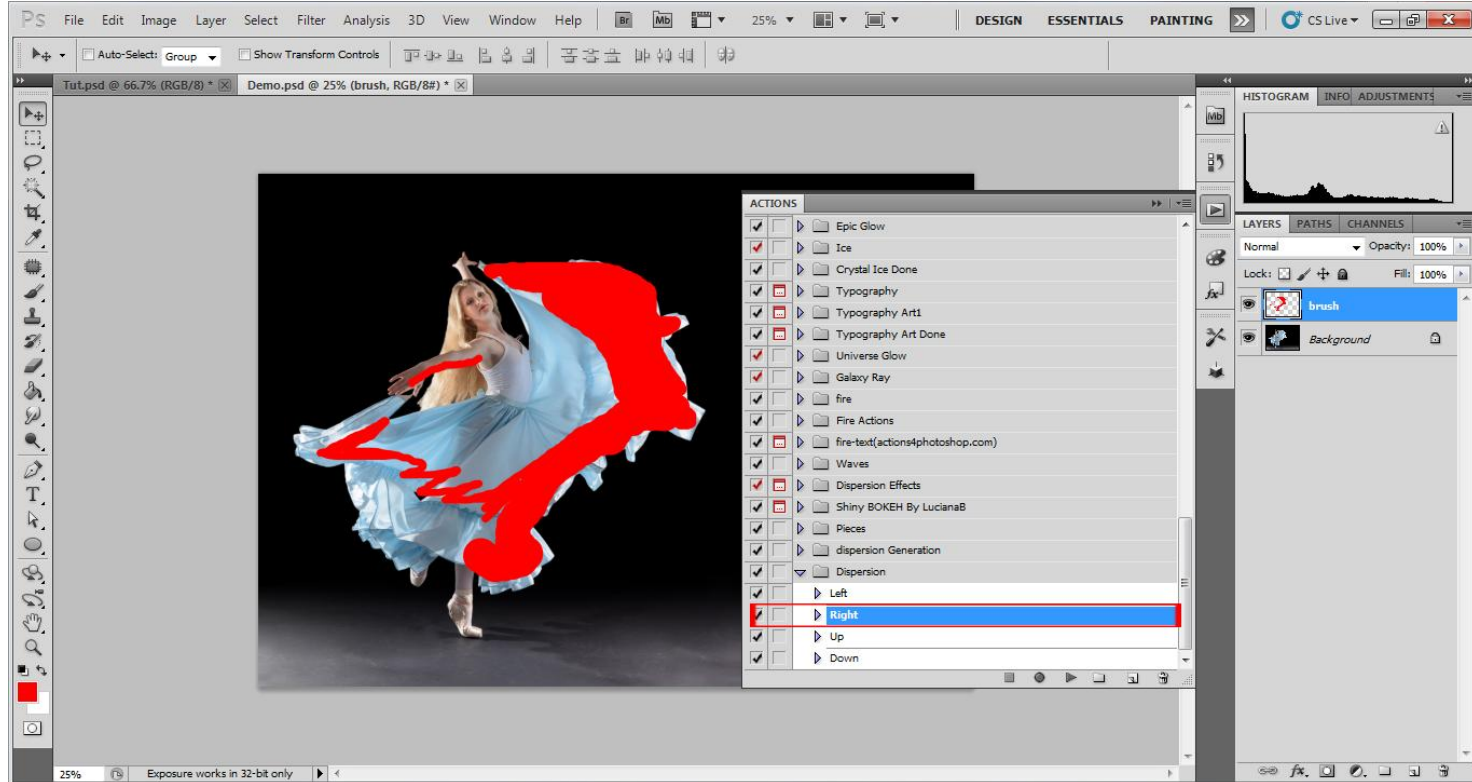
2. Inside the Actions window, click on the top right hand corner icon to reveal the drop down menu. From here select 'Load Actions...'. Select the action which came with the download.



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With “brush” Layer selected and visibleChoose the Action Direction you want to apply , Now click play on the action!



Final Touches 01

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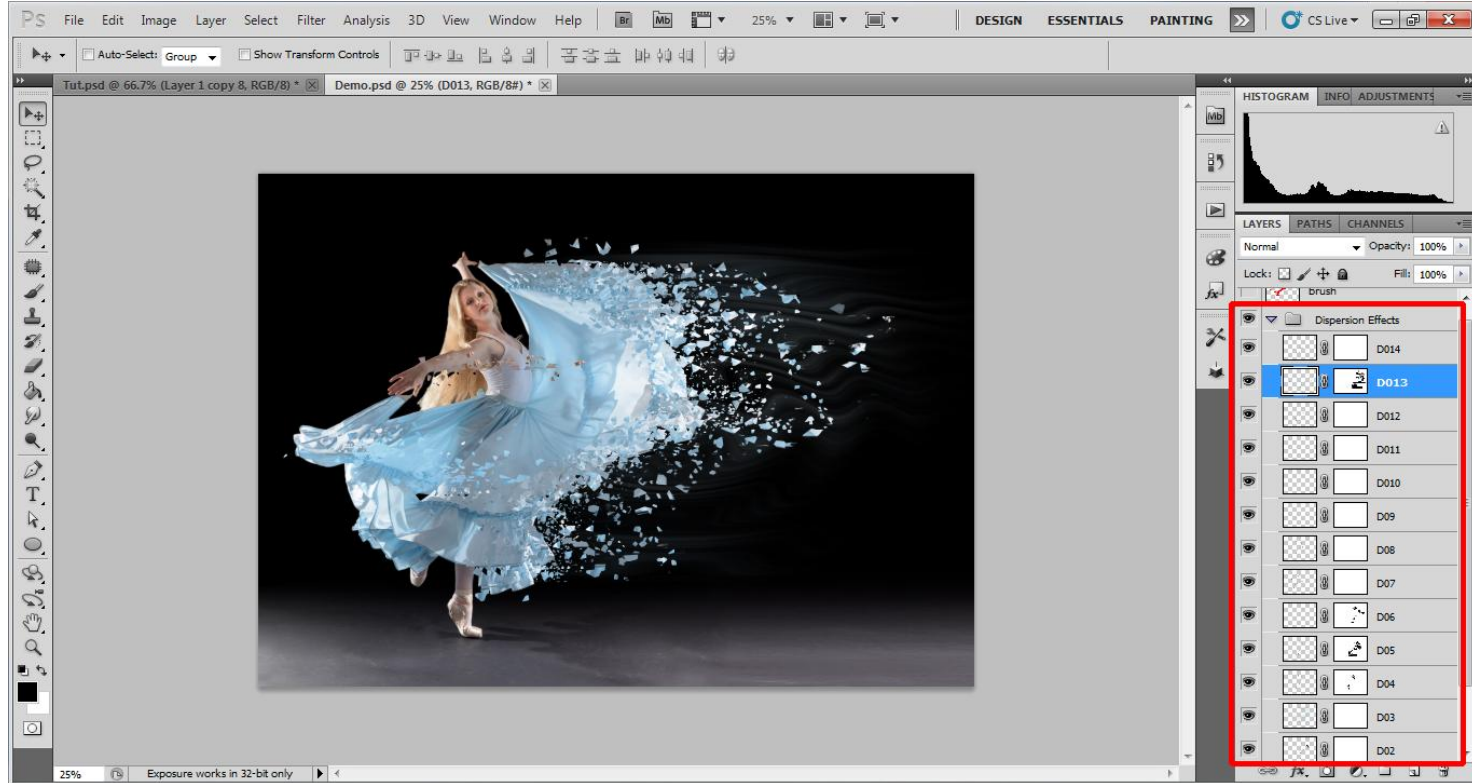
After the Action is Done ,If you want to make your own adjustments , First hide all layers in Dispersion Effects Folder , then start showing them One by one from the Bottom to Top , as shown below , By doing so , You will easily decide which layer needs resizing or duplicating to add more details



Final Touches 02

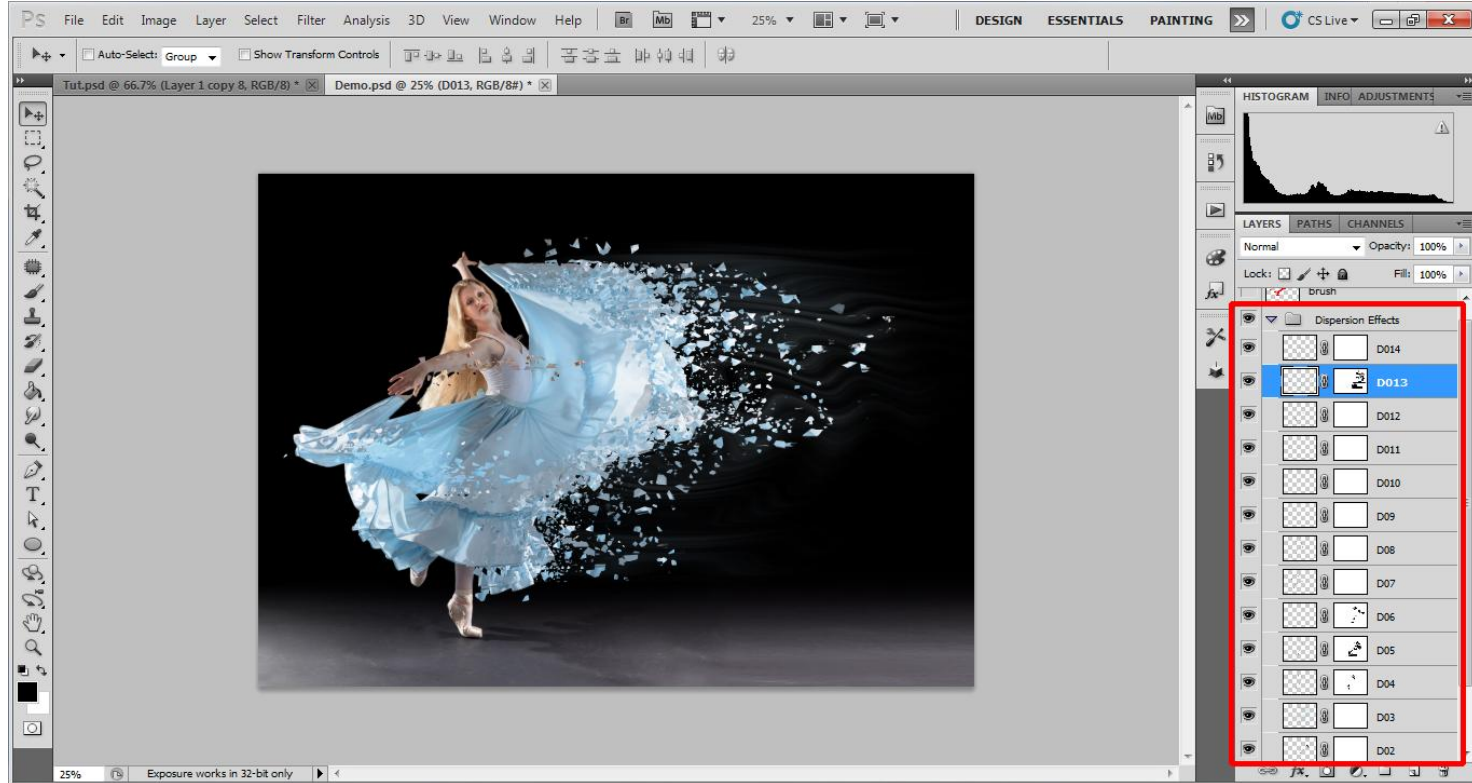
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Make your own adjustments...change colors , masks , hide , appear layers . Change blending mode of layers , duplicate folder layers to add even a more details . Each layer and folder has its own maskyou can use brush tool to show or hide more details.



Final Touches 03

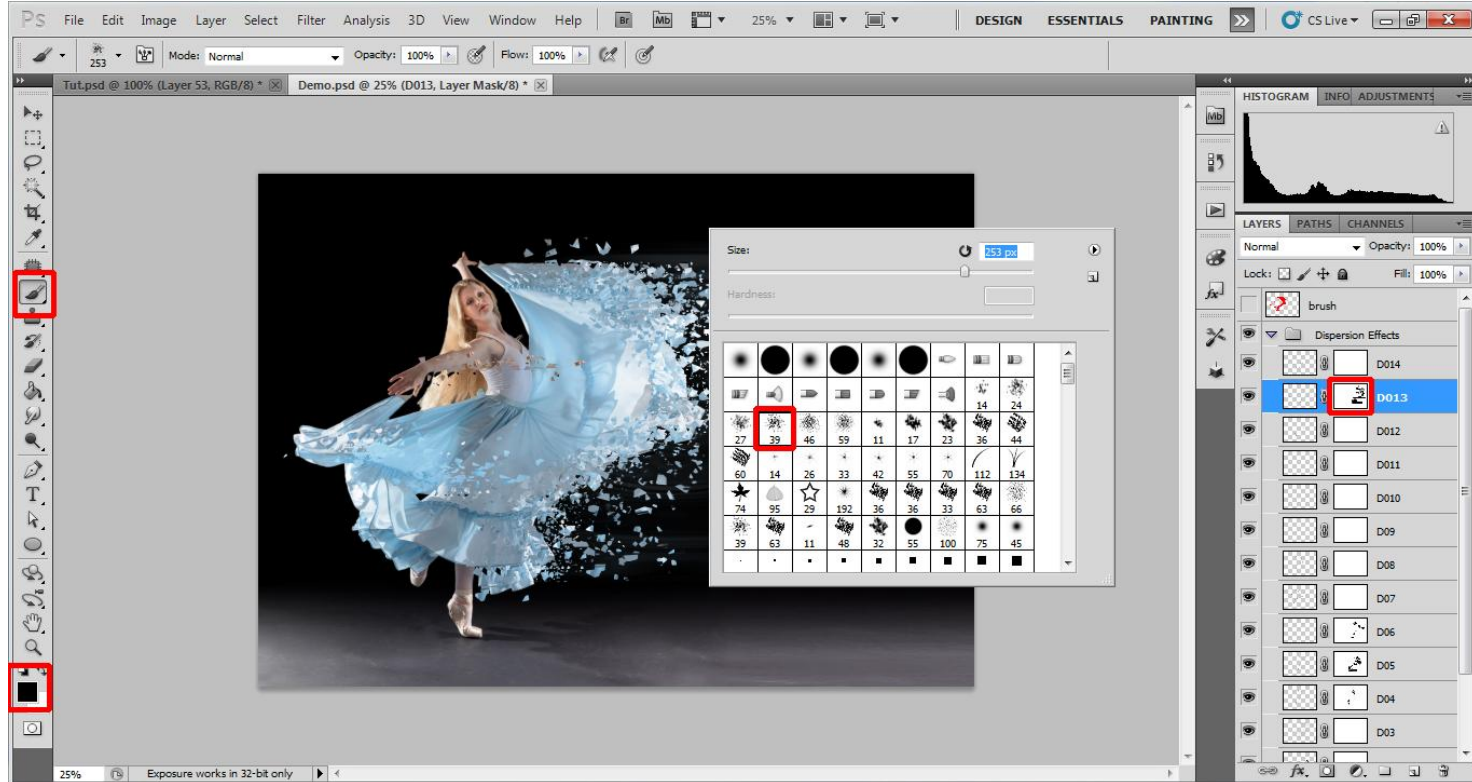
Create lots more parts by duplicating layers! Simply select a layer and hit 'Ctrl+j' to quickly duplicate it. You can even duplicate the entire 'Parts' folder by selecting the folder and hitting 'Ctrl+j'. You can then move the entire folder around. You can also scale the parts by selecting a layer and hitting 'Ctrl+t' – then use the bounding box handles to scale it up or down!



Final Touches 04

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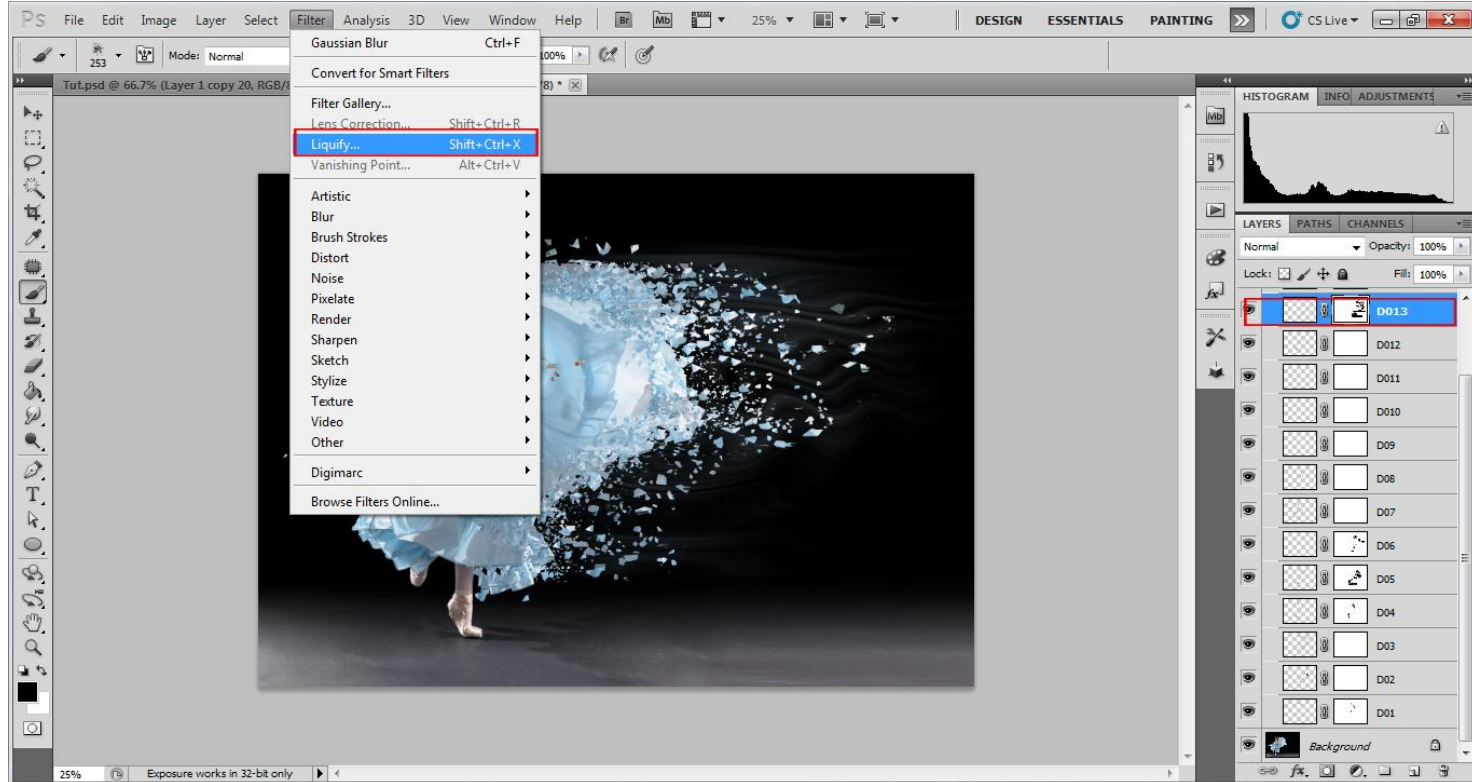
Notice that Each Layer has its mask, So you can use brush Tool with Setting Black color to hide the area you don't want to see ...Make sure the Mask of Layer is selected . Try to use Spatter Brushes as shown below , and brush over the area you don't want to see . Then select layer and hitting 'Ctrl+t' – then use the bounding box handles to scale it up , down , Left . Right .



Final Touches 05

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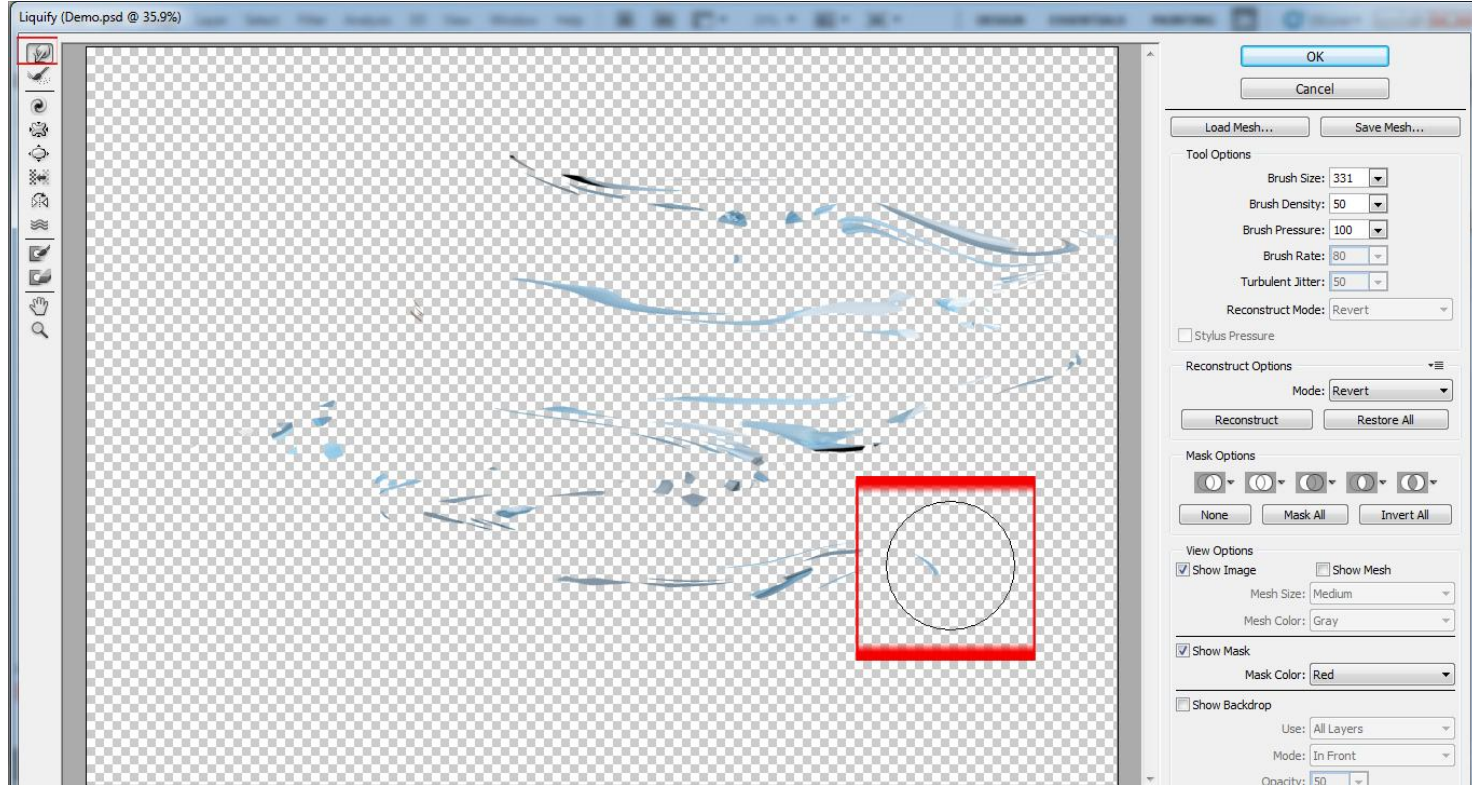
The Magic part is to add some awesome touches , by using Liquify Filter , Duplicate the Layers you want to apply Liquify Filter .
Then Select Liquify Filter as shown Below



Final Touches 06

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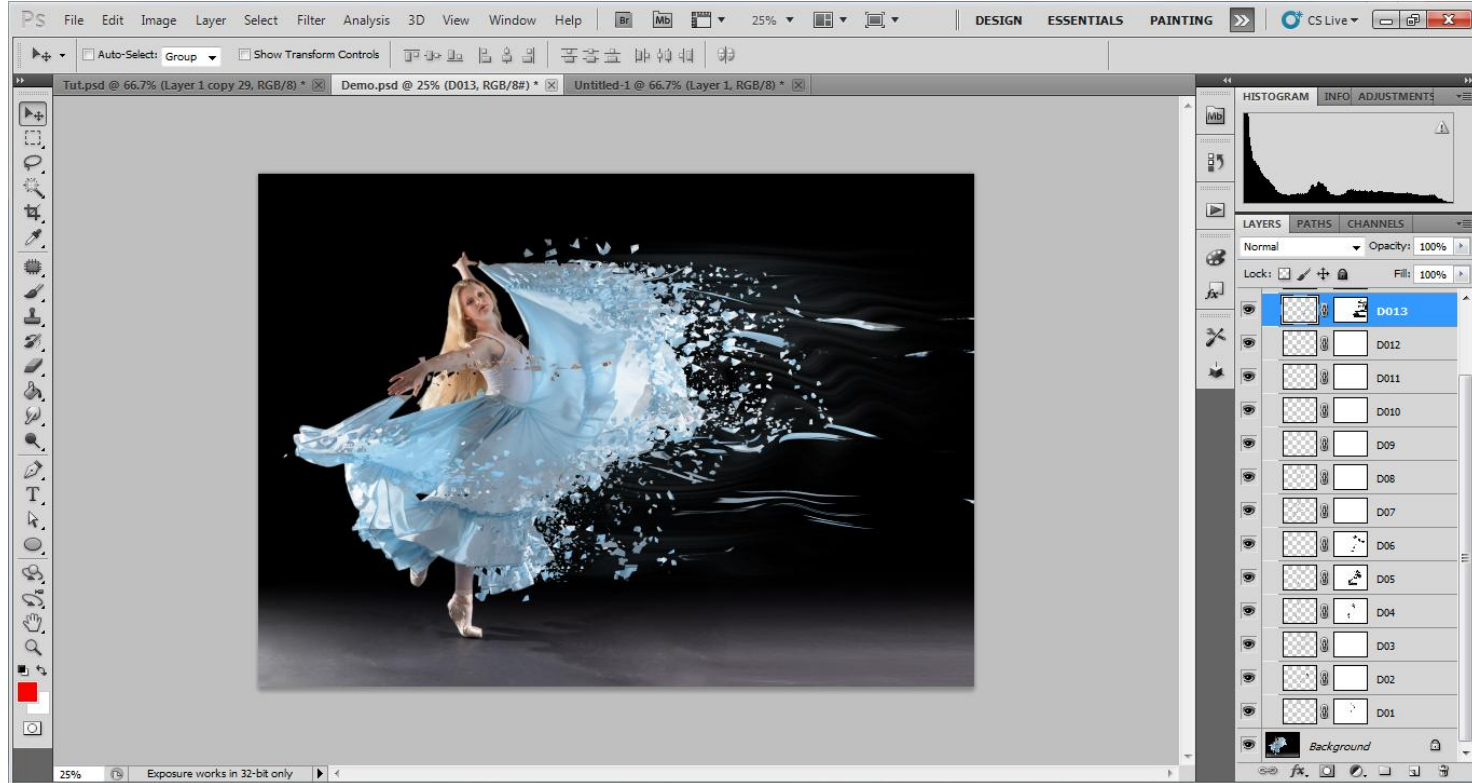
After the Liquify Panel is shown, make the changes you want, then Press Ok.
