

This exercise shows how the Preflight Verifier tool works.

This tool is automatically executed each time you use Save as PDF. (See Toolbar / Save as PDF)

Preflight Verifier is a great tool that helps to detect errors with your layout.

The purpose of this exercise is to get you to see and work with the Preflight Errors.

I created some errors and non-errors on the right. My description of those are below...

1. Text box. PASSED

The quick brown fox was eaten by the angry dog!

2. Text box. FAILED: Overset Text

3 May. Bistritz.--Left Munich at 8:35 P.M., on 1st May, arriving at Vienna early next morning; should have arrived at 6:46, but train was an hour late. Buda-Pesth seems a wonderful place, from the glimpse which I got of it from the train and the little I could walk through the streets. 3. Text box FAILED: off page

4. Graphic Object: PASSED



5. Graphic Object: PASSED. Even though this object flows off the page it still passes preflight.



6. Graphic Object FAILED: this object is completely off the page.

7. Image PASSED



8. Image FAILED: The actual image that the frame points to is missing (intentionally)

9. Image FAILED: this image is below the minimum image resolution standard.



10. Transparent Circle (to right)
FAILED: it is transparent.
