

Formatting lists with CSS

You can modify your bulleted () or numbered () list markers with CSS using the **list-style-type** property. You can apply CSS styles to or selectors, or to individual list items - .

Example:

HTML CSS code:

ul {
list-style-type:upper-roman;
}
</style>

Embedded CSS rule for **ul** creates the list with upper Roman numbering.

Display:

You web design portfolio can include:

- I. **Your resume**
- II. **Samples of graphics you have created**
- III. **Links to Web pages or sites you have designed or contributed to**
- IV. **Samples of other works (photography, print design, or programming**

CSS list-style-type property and values

list-style-type property can have the following values:

list-style-type: **disk** (default marker for unordered lists ())

list-style-type: **circle**

list-style-type: **square**

list-style-type: **decimal** (default marker for ordered lists ())

list-style-type: **upper-roman**

list-style-type: **lower-roman**

list-style-type: **upper-alpha**

list-style-type: **lower-alpha**

The following examples demonstrates different list styles applied to the element:

<code><li style="list-style-type: circle"> circle </code>	◦ circle
<code><li style="list-style-type: square"> square </code>	■ square
<code><li style="list-style-type: decimal"> decimal </code>	4. decimal
<code><li style="list-style-type: upper-roman"> upper-roman </code>	V. upper-roman
<code><li style="list-style-type: lower-roman"> lower-roman </code>	vi. lower-roman
<code><li style="list-style-type: upper-alpha"> upper-alpha </code>	G. upper-alpha
<code><li style="list-style-type: lower-alpha">lower-alpha</code>	h. lower-alpha

Using graphic bullets

Graphic bullets are a great way to customize the appearance of your lists while minimizing download time. To create a custom bullet, use **list-style-image** property.

Example:

```
li {
list-style-image: url(bullet.gif)
}
```

Display

-  item two
